## Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance Entitlement Recertification Due in February

Military personnel who meet household size and income guidelines qualify for a special military pay entitlement called Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance (FSSA). FSSA is a voluntary program designed to assist service members in supporting their family's nutritional needs and is non-taxable. Most importantly, anyone receiving FSSA is required to be recertified annually during the month of February.

FSSA is an income/household-size driven entitlement requiring recertification of eligibility under certain conditions (decrease in household size, monthly

income increase of \$100 or more, promotions and PCS). If you fail to complete the recertification process, your entitlement will most likely be terminated. Military members needing to complete the recertification requirement should make an appointment with the Financial Readiness Office.

If you are not receiving this entitlement and believe you may be eligible, visit the website at <http://www.dmdc.osd.mil/fssa>. Service members will need to use their last name and social security number in order to complete the preliminary application. You will be asked

to enter various data; however, the program will perform the calculations and determine eligibility. Once individuals are initially rated as eligible, please contact the Financial Readiness Office at (586) 307-4554 to schedule an appointment.

# Building in the Shadow of a Volcano: *SeaBees Make Their Mark at Sigonella, Sicily*

Half a million years ago, Mt. Etna, the volcano, began to shape Sicily. Since then, the Carthaginians, Ottomans, Romans, Greeks, Byzantines, Germans, and Italians have left their marks. Now, U.S. Navy "SeaBees" will leave America's mark on this crossroads of the world.

## SeaBees Keep Busy

The SeaBees of the 26th Naval Mobile Construction Battalion (NMCB), 1st Naval Construction Division (1NCD), deployed to Sigonella Naval Air Station (NASSIG), Sicily, in 2003. The 26th is based out of Selfridge Air National Guard Base, Mount Clemens, Mich.

"We were supposed to support the (Army's) Fourth Infantry Division, but when that didn't happen, we were reassigned as a ready battalion in Rota, Spain, and detailed to Sigonella," said Lt. j.g. Patrick Kuhne, commander of the NMCB 26 contingent, and a Reservist from Allen Park, Mich., who is a civilian project manager for the Army Corps of Engineers. "Our families are happy we are here, but the guys would rather be (working) in Iraq," said Kuhne.

One of the projects the SeaBees built was a 12-foot chain-link fence to surround the base. "We made the forms from sheet metal, with no outside engineering other than a fence project team," said Equipment Operator 1st Class David Elliott, project supervisor for the fence.

"We took over building the lighting for a six-acre sports complex (on NASSIG)," said Kuhne. "This complex has a softball field, soccer field, two tennis courts, a basketball court, a parking lot and a restroom facility."

But like Murphy's Law says, "Everything is harder than it looks." The

restroom facility had to be built to local architecture and codes. Even the roof was a local design of concrete with clay tiles. "We had never seen them before, so we had to figure it out," Kuhne said. "We can credit our skilled builders. The (NASSIG) building code is comparable to the local civilian building code, in that we had to use environmentally friendly materials. In the United States when we use PVC pipe, we glue it together for a couple of seconds then put it into the ground. It cannot be done that way here. Locally, we have to use environmentally friendly PVC glue that takes four to five hours to dry."

## Auto Industry Connection

One of the things that make this unit special is approximately one-quarter of the unit works for the auto industry. They used their experience to get vehicles running.

"When we got here we had 34 percent vehicle availability, and within a month it went up to 93 percent," said Kuhne.

Walking through the maintenance bay, one could see mechanics turning wrenches, changing fluids, and making sure all of their equipment is kept in excellent condition. "Lots of good guys working together salvaging equipment and get it running again," said Construction Mechanic 3rd Class Christopher Garcia, from Port Huron, Mich., and an auto design engineer.

## SCWS

"While deployed, some SeaBees worked on their SeaBee Combat Warfare Specialist that requires each SeaBee pass a written and oral board, qualify with their weapon, first aid, and other combat related skills," said Kuhne.

SeaBees start their quest to earn their SCWS with correspondence courses.

After completing all the coursework, a test and two boards stand as hurdles before they can be awarded the SCWS.

"Earning the SCWS designation does not make you surpass your peers' abilities or skills; it makes you surpass the level of knowledge and ability you had possessed. You will be recognized as a motivated SeaBee with the advanced leadership and knowledge required to support (SeaBees)," according to the SeaBee webpage.

## A Bit of History

Traveling from the local civilian airport to this "hub of the Mediterranean" is like taking a trip through the pages of history. Roman ruins stand side-by-side with German-built bunkers and fighting positions in the vast olive fields that surround NASSIG. All of these are markers from major epics of human history.

"We are traveling the same road as Montgomery did during World War II when he was racing Patton to get to Messina," said Senior Chief Petty Officer Robin Wallace, part of the Reserve Liaison Office at Sigonella and a reservist from Memphis, Tenn.

About that time, December 1941 to be exact, Rear Admiral Ben Morell, Chief of the Navy's Bureau of Yards and Docks, recommended establishing Naval Construction Battalions or "CB's" (where they derive their name). With the attack on Pearl Harbor and the U.S. entrance into the war, he was given the go-ahead. Like their "CB" predecessors, these citizen-sailors take what they have learned in their civilian lives and apply it to their modern day "SeaBee" missions.

# Henry B. Joy, Part Two

Part two of the three part series on Henry B. Joy provided by the Selfridge Military Air Museum.

Mr. Henry B. Joy leased Joy Aviation Field to the U.S. Government in 1917 and the site became Selfridge Field, named in honor of the world's first casualty of powered flight, 1Lt Thomas E. Selfridge. Selfridge Field was purchased from Joy in 1921 and it became a permanent military installation. Selfridge Field became Selfridge Air Force Base (AFB) in 1947 when the Air Force became a separate branch of the military and Selfridge AFB became Selfridge Air National Guard (ANG) Base in 1971 when the Air Force transferred control of the historic installation to the Michigan ANG.

With all the missions, projects, and training going on, these SeaBees proudly carry on the “Can Do” spirit.


## About the 26th

# Sigonella Reservists Keep the Air Fleet Flying

When you think of Sicily, you think of Romans, Carthaginians and Greeks; maybe even the ancient active volcano, Mt. Etna. Sicily also has Sigonella Naval Air Station (NASSIG). Its location is important because NASSIG, near the center of the Mediterranean, is at a mid-way point between the Continental United States and Iraq.

“All the troops who go to Italy, all cargo for ships, spare parts, and consumable items flow through here,” said Lt. Cmdr. Timothy Dudley, the active duty fuels officer for NASSIG.

## Fueling the air fleet

Someone has to fuel all these aircraft. The job is done by Reservists with the 2nd Service Support Battalion, Fuels Company G, based at Selfridge Air National Guard Base in Michigan, north of Detroit.

“Reservists are very important, especially during contingency operations,” said Dudley. “We are here supporting not only the Air Mobility Command missions, but we are also supporting the forward deployed fleet in the Mediterranean.”

These fuel specialists are getting a lot of experience in airfield operations.

The airfield is abuzz with activity. Navy P-3 Anti-Submarine aircraft and CH-53 Sea Stallion helicopters, Air Force C-5, C-130, and C-141 cargo aircraft, and a few C-20 Gulfstream corporate jets make the place look more like a major airport than a military airfield in the middle of the Mediterranean Sea.

“I really commend these reservists, they are working hard, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, to get the job done. It’s more than pumping fuel, they also perform quality assurance to ensure the fuel is within specifications before it goes into the planes,” said Dudley. “The workload is difficult because the hydrant systems are down, so everything has to

be done by truck, which takes more people and is a lot more involved.”

“We support the U.S. and foreign military as well,” said Company Commander Lt. Jeff Schneider. “Many exercises, such as Operation DOGFISH for P-3 Anti-Sub, involve U.S., British, German and Italian soldiers,” said Schneider. “We support the fuel operations for the Italians, all government vehicles on base, foreign military vehicles, flight line, equipment, emergency generators... If it needs fuel, we do it.”

“They are utilized to their full ability, because the fuel has to get out there,” said Dudley. “We will take the reservists whenever we can get them...I’d like to have them year-round.”

“They [Reservists] do the missions that couldn’t be done otherwise,” said Dudley. “The Reservists come in and give the active duty a break, and this

allows us to manage the workload. We are a 24/7 operation. It just goes on and on, and we need a lot of Reservists.”

As a Reservist, every profession is important. For some people, the thought of becoming a fuel specialist would be no more exciting than filling up a car in the States. But for the airmen of 2nd Service Battalion, Fuels Company G, who fuel all of the soldiers, sailors, airmen, Marines and Allied Forces that depend on the Sigonella Naval Air Station, every day is exciting.
