927th ARW Engineer Named AFRC CE Manager of the Year

927th Air Refueling Wing Civil Engineer Ms. Michon T. Sentner has been awarded Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) Civil Engineer (CE) Civilian Manager of the Year for 2003.

“We’re proud of the fact that she was named,” said Col. Kenneth Suggs, wing commander. “It’s a testament to not only her professional skills, but interpersonal – being able to work with people.”

“This base is unique in that Michon and CE Technician Laura Howe are basically a two-person shop working all facilities issues for an entire wing,” Col. Suggs said. “They not only have to be technically proficient in engineering, but know how to budget and coordinate joint projects with the Air National Guard.”

“I’m excited about this,” Ms. Sentner said. “It’s unexpected.”

Sentner inherited something of a “mess” when she arrived at the 927th in June of 2002, chiefly because the position had gone vacant for nearly two years, said Col. Suggs and other wing officials.

“It was kind of a black hole,” Ms. Sentner said. “Everything was thrown in and nothing happened to it.”

She was able to use her background in structural engineering and construction to turn around that situation and receive an award in less time than the vacancy existed.

“To be able to come in to a position that was vacant and get Building 301 and the ramp construction project basically completed and get the command post and squadron ops building underway is a herculean effort,” Col. Suggs said.

“It’s a matter of the chips falling where they needed,” Ms. Sentner said. “The key is to balance all facets of the office. This is also the real property office, not just CE.”

Ms. Sentner is among 14 individuals and seven units who won AFRC CE

awards for 2003. Her award recognized her job performance, management ability, technical competence and initiative. She was particularly recognized for her resourcefulness: for using a combination of in-house design, construction contracts, host base engineering shops and the 927th Civil Engineer Squadron to get the job done most effectively. She saved the government \$150,000 by designing in-house the new roofs for buildings 301 and 302.

Ms. Sentner credited her office’s hiring of CE contractor Ms. Joanne Gray with making the difference in the roof projects. “We would never have gotten funding for the roof projects if we hadn’t hired her,” Ms. Sentner said.

Award-winning civil engineering runs in her family. Her husband, Maj. Regan McDonald, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, received a similar award from the Corps of Engineers following

his recent return from a nine-month deployment to Kuwait and Iraq.

The couple is likely to be leaving the area this summer, when Maj. McDonald is expected to be reassigned.

Ms. Sentner hopes to prevent another “black hole” for the wing when she departs.

“I’m hoping to find a good replacement,” she said.


