IMA Town Hall Meeting Held at Detroit Arsenal

On November 6 an eager audience crowded into a cafeteria conference room at the Detroit Arsenal to witness the Installation Management Agency (IMA) Town Hall. The hot topic of discussion was the consolidation of the Detroit Arsenal and the U.S. Army Garrison-Selfridge.

Guest Speaker J. Randall Robinson, Director, Northwest (NW) Region, gave an overview of IMA as well as the consolidation. Robinson stated that the NW Region's priorities are to build a cohesive team and improve installation resources. The consolidation is a step toward accomplishing those goals for this area.

LTC Craig Johnson assumed com-

mand of the consolidated organization on November 8. The name of the consolidated unit is U.S. Army Garrison-Michigan. Permanent orders are forthcoming from the Department of the Army. Liz Fournety will continue to serve as the deputy and SGM David Austin will remain the Garrison senior NCO.

Johnson fielded several questions from the audience who seemed eager to understand the details of the consolidation and their roles in the new organization. He emphasized that the consolidation will likely be transparent to the joint military community. The Garrison will continue to provide the full range of base operations support and

services to tenant organizations at both Selfridge and Detroit Arsenal.

Employment Readiness Program Offers Job-seeking Tips

When reading the hottest articles on Yahoo! [HotJobs website](#), I came across this one by Christopher Jones. It is called "**Five Resume Essentials**" and I really think you may find it very helpful in the job search process.

The author has indicated that there are really only five essential areas that you as a job searcher really need to worry about. I really think that there are many more; however I think this maybe good food for thought.

The tips given are:

1. **Proofread your resume.**
2. **You are what you read.**
3. **Be a resume voyeur.**
4. **The truth about Ms. ASCII.**
5. **More resumes mean more chances.**

I have put some helpful information about resumes within the Employment Readiness Program Directory for Job Seekers used by my clients. I think the information will be more helpful during the job search process.

I have called the section *Guidelines for a Winning Resume*:

First and foremost, you want your resume to look clean, clear, and concise.

Make your strongest statements stand out by placing them at the end of a paragraph where they will be surrounded by space. Avoid the appearance of mass mailing. You should also avoid resumes with bright colors, unusual shapes, and such. In fields such as advertising, merchandising and creative services, unusual resumes are common and appropriate.

Confidentiality is an area of concern. If you are currently employed, you should not hesitate to request that the resume be kept confidential. Although employers understand and respect the need for confidentiality, your mentioning this point provides assurance of confidentiality.

Also I would like to provide some general tips to get you started on your resume, and just maybe you will find the process a little easier to understand.

- Be honest
- Embellish, but do not exaggerate.
- Concentrate on your strengths and goals.
- Use powerful action verbs to describe accomplishments: created,

initiated, developed, increased, trained, etc.

- Do not overuse "I".
 - Do not omit any education or employment history.
 - Do not be humorous.
 - Avoid any reference to religion or political activities.
 - Do not concentrate solely on the past.
 - Write with enthusiasm.
 - Do not rely solely on computer spell-check programs.
 - Check each word to ensure correct spelling. Follow the method used by proofreaders and read your resume backwards when checking spelling.
 - Prepare a draft and review it the next day.
 - Ask trusted friends to review and comment on your resume.

Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance Entitlement Re-certification Due in February

Military personnel who meet household size and income guidelines qualify for a special military pay entitlement called Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance (FSSA). FSSA is a voluntary program designed to assist service members in supporting their family's nutritional needs and is non-taxable. Most importantly, anyone receiving FSSA is required to be re-certified annually during the month of February.

FSSA is an income/household-size

driven entitlement requiring re-certification of eligibility under certain conditions (decrease in household size, monthly income increase of \$100 or more, promotions and PCS). If you fail to complete the re-certification process, your entitlement will most likely be terminated. Military members needing to complete the re-certification requirement should make an appointment with the Financial Readiness Office.

If you are not receiving this entitlement and believe you may be eligible,

visit the website at <http://www.dmdc.osd.mil/fssa>. Service members will need to use their last name and social security number in order to complete the preliminary application. You will be asked to enter various data; however, the program will perform the calculations and determine eligibility. Once individuals are initially rated as eligible, please contact the Financial Readiness Office at (586) 307-4554 to schedule an appointment.

Employers Given a Taste of Military Life

“A once in a lifetime experience,” “awesome,” and “simply amazing” are a sampling of comments made by 54 civilian employers who participated in this year’s 927th Air Refueling Wing Employer Appreciation Day held Nov. 1. Visitors from as far away as Sault St. Marie, in Michigan’s Upper Peninsula, and central Ohio were on hand to gain a greater appreciation for what their reservist-employee does to serve our great nation.

The day began with informational briefings about the Air Force Reserve Command structure, how reservists contribute to the Total Force effort, and the 927ARW mission. Mr. Joseph Gablesberger, southeast Michigan representative for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve, provided information on employment rights, which are afforded to each reservist.

Employers enjoyed a tour of facilities. They seized the opportunity to view and handle some of the equipment used by wing members. Static displays of combat arms, survival equipment and high-tech communication hardware created added excitement among the guests. A KC-135 aircraft, which was undergoing routine maintenance, was

The day reached its climax with an air refueling flight aboard three tankers. The offloading of fuel to F-16s from the 107th Fighter Squadron, Michigan Air National Guard, provided everyone with a bird’s-eye view of aerial refueling from only a short 25 foot distance and

at air speeds of nearly 350 mph.

“This was the most exciting day of my life,” said Ms. Becky Weaver, child welfare supervisor at Bay County Family Independence Agency. “I really gained an appreciation for what reservists and guardsmen do to support our nation’s defense.”
