## Summer Fun With Camp Adventure

If you're looking for something to keep the kids busy this summer, check out Club Adventure, the summer camp for children in K-8th grade. Every week is packed with activities, trips and tons of summer fun and adventure. The regular program includes swimming, bowling, field trips and special events and programs. There are also a number of specialty camps children and youth can sign up for like Fine Arts and Theater, Sports Camp, Science, Amazing Animals and Golf to name a few.

Specialty camps are designed to expand the choices and experiences for children and youth and allow them to focus on the things they really like to do without forcing all kids to do the same thing. Selfridge is a 4H affiliate and offers some great project activities too. As a 4H member, youth can join the Technology, Photo, Archery, Fine Arts, or Fishing clubs.

Children can participate by enrolling in 4H through CYS and then signing up for a specific project club.

There are different options for using Club Adventure. If you need full day care, you can sign for an entire week or weeks at a time and fees are on a sliding scale based on income. To participate in Club Adventure, you must first register your child with CYS. The registration fee is only \$15 per child and includes 6 free hours of open recreation a month for school age children and allows participation in any CYS event, program, sports activity or class.

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## Community Briefs

### U.S. Army Garrison-Michigan Signs Partnership Agreement with Macomb County Schools

During a recent ceremony at Selfridge Air National Guard Base, Lt. Col. Craig Johnson, commander of the U.S. Army Garrison-Michigan, signed a memorandum of agreement with three Macomb County school districts that will now make it easier for military family students to move from one school system to another. The three school districts who signed the agreement were Anchor Bay School District, L'Anse Creuse Public Schools and Mount Clemens Community Schools.

"By signing this agreement, Anchor Bay, L'Anse Creuse and Mount Clemens schools have shown us again their great support for military families," stated Lt. Col. Johnson. "We are certainly proud to be partners with them in our efforts to provide a smooth transition for all military family members."

Military family students change school systems about three times more often than other students. There are currently over 118 other school districts throughout the country who have signed this agreement.

The formal signing ceremony also featured students from Macomb County schools and military family members.

After the Anchor Bay High School Junior ROTC team posted the colors, the national anthem was sung by the L'Anse Creuse North High School Choir.

Essays on how this agreement will affect them were read by Army family member and Anchor Bay High School student Davida Austin and Navy family member and L'Anse Creuse North High School student Katie Lengyel. The ceremony also featured musical selections performed by the Anchor Bay High School Band. And the formal reading of the memorandum of agreement was done by Coast Guard family member and Anchor Bay High School student Nicole Cernat.

The agreement is the result of an earlier Army research effort titled the Secondary Education Transition Study (SETS). This in-depth study made recommendations to improve predictability for military-connected high school aged students during the transition process.

The U.S. Army Garrison-Michigan serves a unique role by providing installation support, housing, morale, welfare, recreation and education services to two separate military installations—Selfridge ANG Base and the Detroit Arsenal in Warren, MI.

## Scholarships for Military Children

Mom and Dad were right when they said, "Money doesn't grow on trees," but thanks to the Scholarships for Military Children program, it does!

Worldwide, 500 diligent students are receiving \$1,500 scholarships to apply toward college tuition this fall. The local winners announced by William Roger, Jr., Store Director at Selfridge ANGB Commissary, are: Cassandra Majestic from Port Huron, MI; Amy Hart from Clyde Township, MI; Jordan Combs from Port Huron, MI and Adam Sheffield from Waterville, OH.

"We're thrilled to report that the scholarship program is an enormous success in helping military families defray the costs of education," said Defense Commissary Agency Director Maj. Gen. Michael P. Wiedemer. "We're proud to be associated with a program that has awarded more than \$3 million to nearly 2,000 students since its inception in 2001."

Scholarship Managers, a professional scholarship firm, selects the winners based on academic merit, participation in extracurricular and volunteer activities, and the quality of their essays.

A record-breaking 7,000 students applied to the program for 2004. Only the winners are officially notified of their status (by letter) to ensure all possible funds go toward scholarships.

According to Edna Hoogewind, DeCA's program liaison, the grade point average of the scholarship recipients is 3.8 – 3.9, and nearly all are members of the National Honor Society, an organization that recognizes students who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership, character and a willingness to serve others.

## Army Takes Lead in In-state Tuition Initiative

The mobility of the military community, coupled with the state-specific criteria for determining eligibility for in-state status for college tuition, results in the military spouse/family member facing a variety of rules and procedures that may not result in designation as in-state residents. The impact affects morale and family decisions on career and retention.

The Army has recognized this and is committed to ensuring Soldiers and their families are afforded educational opportunities equal to the general citizenry.

As the Number One issue from the Army Family Action Plan (AFAP) Conference, November 02, efforts are now being made by the Army to have states adopt an in-state tuition policy favorable to the military and their families.

The status of this initiative was briefed to the Vice Chief of Staff of the Army (VCSA) at the AFAP General Officer Steering Committee, November 03.

The Army's desired outcome is eligibility for in-state tuition rates under each of the following conditions: 1) In-state tuition for Soldiers and family members within the state of legal residence; 2) Immediate in-state tuition for Soldiers and family members in the state of assignment; and, 3) Continuity of in-state tuition once established.

As education is primarily a state responsibility, the Federal government cannot mandate that states provide in-state tuition rates to Soldiers and family members. State legislatures control policy on resident tuition status/rates.

The Education Division, has worked this issue in a concerted effort that involves state governments, State Higher Education Executive Officers, senior military leadership, and installation/base commanders. This effort highlights the contributions made by the Services and DoD, installations, units, individual Soldiers and family members to the state and local communities.

Presently, 43 states have favorable policies for Soldiers and family members, 24 of them meeting all desired outcomes. 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
